This is the 10th Europe Oceania conference taking place in the week before Easter, this time being held in France in the Three Valleys at the resort of Val Thorens. Val Thorens is the highest alpine resort in Europe (2300m altitude) offering heaps for non-skiers and skiers alike. Non-skiers can take a cable car to the roof of the world, take in lunch or coffee on the slopes, do tobogganing or snow walking. There's superb doorstep skiing forming part of the huge Les 3 Vallées linked ski area. With over 600km of piste, it is the largest linked ski area in the world. Set in a huge ski bowl, with runs fanning out in all directions, Val Thorens was a site for the 1992 Winter Olympics. Snow conditions are excellent throughout the season, late March early April being an ideal time to be there. Les 3 Vallées has some of the most amazing skiing you will ever encounter!

Other facilities include a sports centre with indoor swimming pool, sauna, squash, tennis, fun park and outdoor skating rink. Hang-gliding, snow scooters, paragliding are also available. The cinema has many films in English, plus you can sample the varied cuisine or go shopping in the arcades and stylish boutiques. Children are well catered for with locally run facilities such as the new toboggan area in the middle of the resort (Place Caron) which is great fun for children (from the age of 2). As for the over eight year olds, they can enjoy the incredible sensations of the highest & longest toboggan run in France!

ACCOMMODATION

We can offer a range of accommodation to suits all tastes and budgets.

"Val – Chavière": Our main conference accommodation in 2010 was the delightful hotel "Val – Chavière", a 3 star property in a superb ski-in/out location with tremendous views of the mountains, located on the slopes as well as being only a few minutes from the resort centre. The Val Chavière offers a very warm welcome and a friendly relaxed atmosphere in basic yet comfortable accommodation. The rate for a Double room in 2010 was \$320 per night, including dinner bed & breakfast.

"Le Val Thorens": Offering a higher standard of accommodation the charming hotel "Le Val Thorens", shares the great doorstep skiing location and close to the town. This hotel boasts facilities such as Piano Lounge and a Fitness Centre which includes a sauna, whirl-pool bath and relaxation room – both to help you relax and unwind after a good day on the slopes! 2010 Rates were \$550 per night for a double room including dinner bed & breakfast.

L'Oxalys: At the upper end we have the delectable L'Oxalys, providing luxury chalet apartments on the slopes for 2-8 people. This exquisite residence has a renowned Michelin starred gourmet restaurant and also a relaxation centre with its pool, spa, hammam and sauna and "Oxlays Spa" (limited access by reservation). Rates are available on an individual basis by request; in 2010 they started at \$490 approx per night for a 2 person apartment (no meals, towels and linen provided).

HOW TO GET THERE

There are a few transport options for getting to the conference at Val Thorens, the decision on which is best for you will probably initially depend upon your international flight connections and times, or whether you are travelling from somewhere else within Europe. The best airports for international flights are Geneva, Lyon or Paris. Geneva is 150km or about 3.5 hours by road and a really nice place to incorporate a stopover prior to or after the conference. Lyon is 180km away or 3 hours by road. Paris is always a great stopover at either end of the our conference plus Paris has train connections to Berlin, the venue for our post Easter conference. There are many trains between Paris and Moutiers, which is the main resort train/transport gateway, 37km or a 40 min- 1 hour journey away from Val Thorens. (Trains run from Moutiers to other major cities and Geneva/Lyon Airports). Our office can advise and can provide booking services for most transport arrangements.

Car Hire If you would like to drive yourself to the resort, cars can be hired via our office. Please note the resort of Val Thorens is a pedestrian resort. All cars must be parked in one of the open or undercover car parks in and around the resort. www.valthoparc.com provides current prices and reservation facilities.

REGISTRATION
